

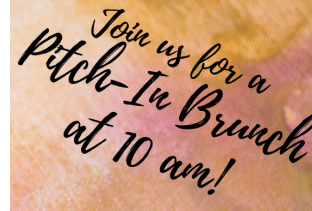
**YOUNG CHILDREN**

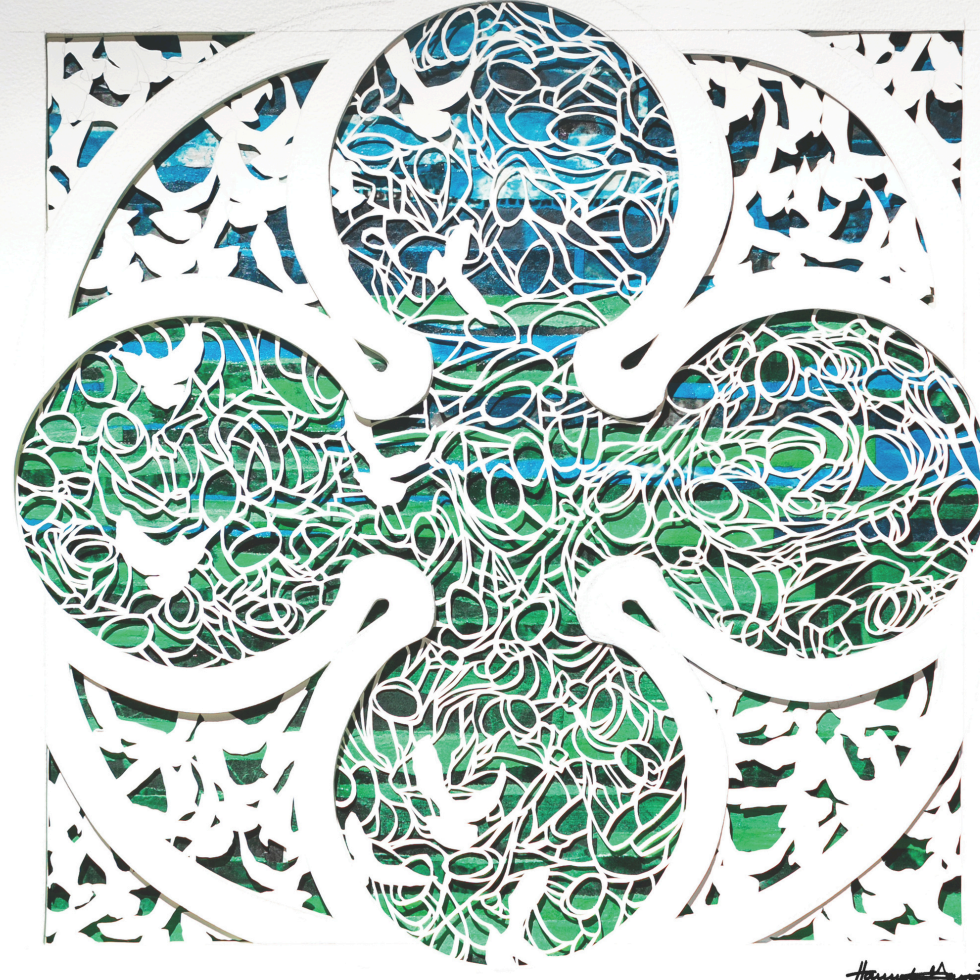

In this piece, the figures are dancing and celebrating while doves fly. The cross mirrors a traditional four-petaled stained-glass window, long-used in European architecture. The dancing people celebrate the resurrection, fearlessly awaiting his arrival in Galilee. The Roman tool of oppression—the cross—inflicts but a pause in the steadfast and abiding ministry of revolutionary love offered by Jesus in his ministry. It is fitting to be back where it began! God has overcome death! Hallelujah!

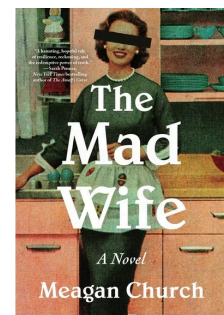


